Location : Cape Town, South Africa

Duration : 12 months (3, 6, or 9 month Advanced Sub-Specialty Training Opportunities may be negotiated)

Hours : Full-time

After-hours : No on-call commitments

Salary : Not funded

Applications are invited for a Fellowship attached to the Paediatric Ophthalmology Department at the Red Cross War Memorial Children's Hospital.

Two Fellowship posts are available:

- 1) Clinical Fellowship (clinical + surgery)
- 2) Clinical + Research Fellowship (clinical + research + limited surgery)

Fellows will work under the supervision of two full-time Paediatric Ophthalmologists - Dr. Christopher Tinley and Dr. Nicola Freeman, alongside the University of Cape Town Ophthalmology registrar.

This fellowship opportunity is intended for those with an interest in developing their expertise in paediatric ophthalmology at a more senior level.

Competencies (knowledge/skills):

- Ability to communicate in English
- Applicants should have completed their higher surgical training in ophthalmology
- Candidates for the clinical fellowship are expected to have extensive cataract surgical experience and be able to routinely perform phacoemulsification surgery unsupervised

Duties (key result areas/outputs):

1) Clinical Fellowship:

- Patient management (medical and surgical care) of children with paediatric ophthalmological disorders, specifically strabismus, congenital cataract, glaucoma, retinoblastoma and retinopathy of prematurity
- Services are provided for in-patient and out-patient care in a paediatric setting
- Participation in the academic program of the University of Cape Town Division of Ophthalmology, and teaching at various levels (undergraduates, ophthalmology registrars and other health care professionals)
- Competent quality of care, including clinical administration and audit

Availability: The next post for this position is available from **September 2020**

2) Research Fellowship:

- During their time, these fellows will be expected to conduct clinical research for the purposes of publication in peer-reviewed journals
- Research Fellows will be exposed to and assist with paediatric ophthalmic surgery, but there will be a limited capacity for them to actually perform surgery. They will be involved in the medical care of children with paediatric ophthalmological disorders, specifically strabismus, congenital cataract, glaucoma, retinoblastoma and retinopathy of prematurity.

- Services are provided for in-patient and out-patient care in a paediatric setting
- Participation in the academic program of the University of Cape Town Division of Ophthalmology, and teaching at various levels (undergraduates, ophthalmology registrars and other health care professionals)
- Competent quality of care, including clinical administration and audit

Availability: The next post for this position is available from **June 2018**

***NB The successful candidate will be required to be registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa (HPCSA) and be in possession of a valid visa.**

The process of HPCSA registration can take up to 12 months.
